Our firm, Hamilton Wealth, LLC, is an investment adviser registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. We feel that it is important for you to understand how advisory and brokerage services and fees differ in order to determine which type of account is right for you. What investment services and advice can you provide me?

We are a registered investment adviser that offers investment advisory services to retail investors. Our firm offers Wrap Comprehensive Portfolio Management services. If you open an advisory account with our firm, we'll meet with you to understand your current financial situation, existing resources, goals, and risk tolerance. Based on what we learn, we'll recommend a portfolio of investments that is monitored regularly, and if necessary, rebalanced to meet your changing needs, stated goals and objectives. We'll offer you advice on a regular basis and contact you at least annually to discuss your portfolio.

You can select in our agreement whether we are allowed to buy and sell investments in your account without asking you in advance ("discretion") or only buy and sell investments in your account after receiving your permission ("non-discretion"). If you select non-discretion, you make the ultimate decision regarding the purchase or sale of investments. Any limitations will be described in the signed advisory agreement. We will have discretion or non-discretion until the advisory agreement is terminated by you or our firm.

We do not restrict our advice to limited types of products or investments.

What fees will I pay?

You will be charged an ongoing quarterly fee based on the value of the investments in your account. The maximum annual fee for our Comprehensive Portfolio Management Services is 1%. The more assets you have in your advisory account, the more you will pay us. Our fees vary and are negotiable. The amount you pay will depend, for example, on the services you receive and the amount of assets in your account. Our firm's fees will be automatically deducted from your advisory account, which will reduce the value of your advisory account. In rare cases, our firm will agree to send you invoices rather than automatically deduct our firm's fees from your advisory account.

The broker-dealer who acts as your custodian and that holds your assets charges you a transaction fee when we buy or sell an investment for you. We pay the broker-dealer's transaction fees charged to you for our Wrap Comprehensive Portfolio Management service.

You may also pay charges imposed by the broker-dealer who acts as the custodian holding your accounts for certain investments and maintaining your account. Some investments, such as mutual funds, index funds, and exchange traded fund charge additional fees such as internal expense ratios that will reduce the value of your investments over time.

You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce any amount of money you make on your investments over time. Please make sure you understand what fees and costs you are paying.

What are your legal obligations to me when acting as my investment adviser? How else does your firm make money and what conflicts of interest do you have?

When we act as your investment adviser, we have to act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours. At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they can affect the investment advice, we provide you. Here are some examples to help you understand what this means:

Our firm's financial professionals include licensed insurance agents who sell insurance products for a commission. They have an incentive to recommend insurance products to you in order to increase their compensation.

For our wrap service, we pay the broker-dealer who acts as your custodian's transaction fees charged to you for most types of assets except for Domestic Equity and Exchange Traded Fund Transactions. As a result, we have an incentive to recommend Domestic Equities and Exchange Traded Funds in order to reduce the amount of the transaction fees that we will have to pay on your behalf.
